Let me end with a reminder that we must all renew our memberships soon and that also applies to any BAOC club only members, who should complete the enclosed standard membership form and return to me with their f2. BOF should be issuing their computerised renewal forms in mid-Dec 91, probably before you receive this newsletter. Please can you all return these promptly (yes that means you Phil Stuart, Mick Goode and others), as this years Brits are in Mar 92 and you may not be eligible. It also means extra work for me and BOF having to chase you. I would also ask that if anyone is going to let their membership lapse for whatever reason, could you please de-register with me so that I can remove you from the mailing list, a phone call will do. We have also had problems this year with non-BAOC members running at colour coded events under our name and I would ask that units do not run under the BAOC name, use your unit name and then get them to join if they want to do more than the 3 introductory events. You are only getting us a bad name, especially as these novices invariably run too hard a course or break cause some other problem.

Well thats my sermon out of the way for this year. My new years resolution is to try and improve BAOC's creditability at event organisation, which has suffered lately, mainly because we do not get the support from club members at events and have to run things on a shoe string. Therefore in 1992 we will drop the usual C3 in September and just concentrate on CROESO 92. The Inter-Corps will be run by the Gunner's in the SW probably combined with a Sarum/BAOC C4 on the area to be used for the 92 Army Champs. We may also hold another C4 on Bordon Heaths late in 92 or early 93, prior to the JK 93 build up and then there will be a BAOC C3 on the Woolmer/Longmoor JK 93 map on 19 Sep 93, probably proceeded by the Inter Corps Championships, That should be and excellent year for orienteering as it is also hoped to hold the Army championships in Berlin in Oct/Nov 93.
